

EMPLOYMENT APPEALS BOARD DECISION

2014-EAB-0972

*Affirmed
Disqualification*

PROCEDURAL HISTORY: On March 31, 2014, the Oregon Employment Department (the Department) served notice of an administrative decision concluding claimant voluntarily left work with good cause (decision # 130622). The employer filed a timely request for hearing. On May 15, 2014, ALJ Clink conducted a hearing, and on May 16, 2014, issued Hearing Decision 14-UI-17811, concluding claimant voluntarily left work without good cause. On June 5, 2014, claimant filed an application for review with the Employment Appeals Board (EAB).

In claimant's written argument, claimant included information from his doctor that was not part of the hearing record. Under OAR 471-041-0090 (October 29, 2006), EAB may consider information not included in the hearing record if the party offering the information shows that circumstances beyond the party's reasonable control prevented the party from presenting the information at hearing. Claimant provided no explanation as to why the information in the written argument was not presented at hearing. In addition, claimant failed to certify that a copy of the written argument was provided to the other parties as required by OAR 471-041-0080(2)(a). Accordingly, we did not consider the claimant's written argument in reaching this decision.

EAB reviewed the entire hearing record. On *de novo* review and pursuant to ORS 657.275(2), the hearing decision under review is **adopted**.

DECISION: Hearing Decision 14-UI-17811 is affirmed.
