

EMPLOYMENT APPEALS BOARD DECISION

2014-EAB-1791

Affirmed
Disqualification
Overpayment Assessed

PROCEDURAL HISTORY: On April 17, 2014, the Oregon Employment Department (the Department) served notice of an administrative decision concluding claimant voluntarily left work without good cause (decision # 115705). On May 7, 2014, decision # 115705 became final without a request for hearing having been filed. On August 29, 2014, the Department served notice of an administrative decision (decision # 135814) assessing a \$6,240 overpayment based on decision # 115705. On September 18, 2014, claimant filed an untimely request for hearing on decision # 115705 and a timely request for hearing on decision # 135814. On November 3, 2014, ALJ S. Lee conducted a consolidated hearing, and on November 13, 2014 issued Hearing Decisions 14-UI-28577 and 14-UI-28580, granting a late request for hearing on decision # 115705 and affirming the administrative decisions. On November 25, 2014, claimant filed applications for review of both hearing decisions with the Employment Appeals Board (EAB).

Pursuant to OAR 471-041-0095 (October 29, 2006), EAB consolidated its review of Hearing Decisions 14-UI-28577 and 14-UI-28580. For case-tracking purposes, this decision is being issued in duplicate (EAB Decisions 2014-EAB-1790 and 2014-EAB-1791).

EAB reviewed the entire hearing record. On *de novo* review and pursuant to ORS 657.275(2), the hearing decisions under review are **adopted**.

DECISION: Hearing Decisions 14-UI-28577 and 14-UI-28580 are affirmed.
