EMPLOYMENT APPEALS BOARD DECISION 2014-EAB-1891

Affirmed No Disqualification

PROCEDURAL HISTORY: On October 24, 2014, the Oregon Employment Department (the Department) served notice of an administrative decision concluding the employer discharged claimant for misconduct (decision # 134632). Claimant filed a timely request for hearing. On December 1, 2014, ALJ Lohr conducted a hearing in which the employer did not participate, and issued Hearing Decision 14-UI-29611, concluding that the employer discharged claimant, but not for misconduct. On December 11,2014, the employer filed an application for review with the Employment Appeals Board (EAB).

In its application for review, the employer's representative asked for "review of this case due to dismissal for failure to appear." The employer's request is construed as a request to have EAB consider new information under OAR 471-041-0090 (October 29, 2006), which allows EAB to consider new information if the party offering the information shows it was prevented by circumstances beyond its reasonable control from presenting the information at the hearing. In support of its request, the employer's representative explained that he did not receive notice of the December 1 hearing until December 3, 2014. Notice of the December 1 hearing was mailed to the employer's representative provided no further details about the failure to receive the notice, *e.g.*, how the notice of hearing was received, what were the employer's office hours during the relevant period, when the employer's mail was delivered, picked up, and processed, and by whom, etc. Without these details, we have no reason to conclude that the employer's request to present new information is denied.

EAB reviewed the entire hearing record. On *de novo* review and pursuant to ORS 657.275(2), the hearing decision under review is **adopted.**

DECISION: Hearing Decision 14-UI-29611 is affirmed.
