

## EMPLOYMENT APPEALS BOARD DECISION

2014-EAB-1961

*Affirmed*  
*No Disqualification*

**PROCEDURAL HISTORY:** On December 12, 2014, the Oregon Employment Department (the Department) served notice of an administrative decision concluding claimant voluntarily left work with good cause (decision # 85935). Claimant filed a timely request for hearing. On December 22, 2014, ALJ Kangas issued Hearing Decision 14-UI-30749, dismissing claimant's request for hearing as presenting no justiciable controversy. On December 29, 2014, claimant filed an application for review with the Employment Appeals Board (EAB).

EAB reviewed the entire hearing record. On *de novo* review and pursuant to ORS 657.275(2), the hearing decision under review is **adopted**.<sup>1</sup>

**DECISION:** Hearing Decision 14-UI-30749 is affirmed. Administrative decision # 85935 remains undisturbed.

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<sup>1</sup> Claimant requested a hearing on an administrative decision that did not disqualify him from unemployment insurance. Claimant then requested a review of Hearing Decision 14-UI-30749, which concluded no portion of the administrative decision was adverse to him or had any practical effect on his rights or interests. Claimant has not assigned error to any portion of the decision and has not requested reversal of any portion of the decision. If claimant is currently disqualified from the receipt of unemployment insurance benefits, it is not as a result of this administrative decision or Hearing Decision 14-UI-30749.
