EMPLOYMENT APPEALS BOARD DECISION 2016-EAB-0296

Affirmed Disqualification

PROCEDURAL HISTORY: On February 4, 2016, the Oregon Employment Department (the Department) served notice of an administrative decision concluding the employer discharged claimant for misconduct (decision # 155404). Claimant filed a timely request for hearing. On March 9, 2016, ALJ R. Frank conducted a hearing, and on March 11, 2016 issued Hearing Decision 16-UI-54923, affirming the Department's decision. On March 15, 2016, claimant filed an application for review with the Employment Appeals Board (EAB).

Claimant failed to certify that she provided a copy of her argument to the other parties as required by OAR 471-041-0080(2)(a) (October 29, 2006). The argument also contained information that was not part of the hearing record, and failed to show that factors or circumstances beyond claimant's reasonable control prevented her from offering the information during the hearing as required by OAR 471-041-0090 (October 29, 2006). We considered only information received into evidence at the hearing when reaching this decision. See ORS 657.275(2). Even if we had considered claimant's argument the outcome of this decision would remain the same because the record shows that claimant engaged in criminal activity that caused her to lose her certification to work as a home caregiver, thus creating the circumstances under which it was impossible for the employer to continue to employer, which is considered misconduct for purposes of receiving unemployment insurance benefits.

EAB reviewed the entire hearing record. On de novo review and pursuant to ORS 657.275(2), the hearing decision under review is **adopted**.

DECISION: Hearing Decision 16-UI-54923 is affirmed.
