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EMPLOYMENT APPEALS BOARD DECISION 2021-EAB-0562

Affirmed
Late Request for Hearing Dismissed

PROCEDURAL HISTORY: On January 13, 2021, the Oregon Employment Department (the Department) served a Notice of Determination for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA) concluding that claimant was not entitled to PUA effective March 22, 2020. On February 2, 2021, the January 13, 2021 administrative decision became final without claimant having filed a request for hearing. On April 9, 2021, claimant filed a late request for hearing. ALJ Kangas reviewed claimant's request, and on May 12, 2021, issued order No. 21-UI-166578, dismissing claimant's request for hearing as late, subject to claimant's right to renew the request by responding to an appellant questionnaire by May 26, 2021.

On June 1, 2021, claimant filed a late response to the appellant questionnaire and a timely application for review of Order No. 21-UI-166578 with the Employment Appeals Board (EAB). On June 10, 2021, ALJ Kangas mailed a letter to claimant stating that because claimant's response to the questionnaire was late, the office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) would not consider it or issue another order, and that Order No. 21-UI-166578 remained in effect. This matter is before EAB based upon claimant's timely application for review of Order No. 21-UI-166578.

EVIDENTIARY MATTER: EAB has considered additional evidence when reaching this decision under OAR 471-041-0090(1) (May 13, 2019). The additional evidence consists of claimant's response to the appellant questionnaire, and has been marked as EAB Exhibit 1, and a copy provided to the parties with this decision. Any party that objects to our admitting EAB Exhibit 1 must submit such objection to this office in writing, setting forth the basis of the objection in writing, within ten days of our mailing this decision. OAR 471-041-0090(2). Unless such objection is received and sustained, the exhibit will remain in the record.

FINDINGS OF FACT: (1) On January 13, 2021, the Department mailed the January 13, 2021 administrative decision to claimant's address on file with the Department. The January 13, 2021 administrative decision stated, "You have the right to appeal this decision if you do not believe it is correct. Your request for appeal must be received by February 2, 2021." Exhibit 1 at 2. The January 13,

2021 administrative decision also provided a P.O. box address and a fax number for use in contacting the Department. Exhibit 1 at 1.

- (2) Claimant received the January 13, 2021 administrative decision at some point after it was mailed.
- (3) On April 9, 2021, claimant filed a request for hearing on the January 13, 2021 administrative decision. Exhibit 2 at 2.

CONCLUSIONS AND REASONS: Claimant's late request for hearing on the January 13, 2021 administrative decision is dismissed.

ORS 657.269 provides that the Department's decisions become final unless a party files a request for hearing within 20 days after the date the decision is mailed. ORS 657.875 provides that the 20-day deadline may be extended a "reasonable time" upon a showing of "good cause." OAR 471-040-0010 (February 10, 2012) provides that "good cause" includes factors beyond an applicant's reasonable control or an excusable mistake, and defines "reasonable time" as seven days after those factors ceased to exist.

On January 13, 2021, the Department mailed the January 13, 2021 administrative decision to claimant at claimant's address of record on file with the Department. The 20-day deadline for claimant to file a timely request for hearing on that decision was February 2, 2021. Claimant did not file a request for hearing on the January 13, 2021 administrative decision until April 9, 2021. Accordingly, claimant's request for hearing was late.

In their appellant questionnaire response, claimant stated they did not request a hearing before the February 2, 2021 deadline because claimant mistakenly believed "that the window to appeal was 90 days[.]" EAB Exhibit 1. They also stated that "homelessness" and "lack of reliable Internet access" were barriers to meeting deadlines that they had experienced generally. EAB Exhibit 1. This evidence is not sufficient to establish good cause for claimant's late request for hearing.

Claimant did not establish that factors beyond their reasonable control prevented them from filing a timely hearing request. The exact date on which claimant received the administrative decision is unknown. However, claimant did not dispute receiving the decision or otherwise rebut the presumption that it was received in the regular course of the mail. OAR 137-003-0520(10) (January 31, 2012) ("Documents sent through the U.S. Postal Service by regular mail are presumed to have been received by the addressee, subject to evidence to the contrary."); see also ORS 40.135(1)(q). The January 13, 2021 administrative decision informed claimant that they had a right to appeal the decision if they did not believe it was correct, and that February 2, 2021 was the deadline for doing so. Claimant's mistaken belief that they had 90 days from the date the administrative decision was issued to file a timely appeal did not constitute a circumstance beyond their reasonable control that prevented them from filing a request for hearing by the February 2, 2021 deadline. Viewed objectively, it was within claimant's reasonable control to carefully read the January 13, 2021 administrative decision and request a hearing by the deadline that was stated therein. Claimant also referenced "homelessness" and "lack of reliable Internet access" as barriers to meeting deadlines that they had experienced generally. EAB Exhibit 1. However, claimant did not establish that these difficulties constituted circumstances beyond their reasonable control that prevented a timely filing because claimant did not explain how, if at all,

homelessness or lack of reliable internet access affected their ability to file a hearing request by the February 2, 2021 deadline.

To the extent that claimant's failure to file a timely hearing request was the result of a mistake on claimant's part that they had 90 days from the date the January 13, 2021 administrative decision was issued to timely file an appeal, claimant did not show that the mistake was an "excusable mistake" within the meaning of the administrative rules. The record does not, for example, raise a due process issue, and fails to show that any mistake was the result of inadequate notice, reasonable reliance on another, or the inability to follow directions despite substantial efforts to comply.

Because claimant failed to show that factors beyond their reasonable control or an excusable mistake prevented them from filing a hearing request on the January 13, 2021 administrative decision by the February 2, 2021 deadline, claimant failed to establish good cause to extend the filing deadline beyond that date. Accordingly, claimant's late request for hearing is dismissed.

DECISION: Order No. 21-UI-166578 is affirmed.
