

EMPLOYMENT APPEALS BOARD DECISION
2024-EAB-0715

Late Applications for Review Dismissed

PROCEDURAL HISTORY: On November 24, 2020, the Oregon Employment Department (the Department) served notice of an administrative decision concluding that claimant quit work without good cause and was disqualified from receiving benefits effective November 17, 2019 (decision # 104209). On December 14, 2020, decision # 104209 became final without claimant having filed a request for hearing. On June 24, 2021, the Department served notice of an administrative decision based partly on decision # 104209, concluding that claimant willfully made a misrepresentation and failed to report a material fact to obtain \$19,180 in regular unemployment insurance (regular UI), Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC), and Lost Wages Assistance (LWA) benefits that claimant must repay, plus a \$2,742 monetary penalty, and that claimant was disqualified for 52 weeks of future benefits. On July 14, 2021, the June 24, 2021, overpayment decision became final without claimant having filed a request for hearing.

On September 3, 2024, claimant filed late requests for hearing on decision # 104209 and the June 24, 2021, overpayment decision. ALJ Scott considered the requests, and on September 18, 2024, issued Orders No. 24-UI-266505 and 24-UI-266501, dismissing the requests as late, subject to claimant's right to renew the requests by responding to an appellant questionnaire by October 2, 2024. On October 8, 2024, Orders No. 24-UI-266505 and 24-UI-266501 became final without claimant having responded to the appellant questionnaire or filed applications for review with the Employment Appeals Board (EAB). On October 9, 2024, claimant filed a late response to the appellant questionnaire and late applications for review of Orders No. 24-UI-266505 and 24-UI-266501 with EAB.

Pursuant to OAR 471-041-0095 (October 29, 2006), EAB consolidated its review of Orders No. 24-UI-266505 and 24-UI-266501. For case-tracking purposes, this decision is being issued in duplicate (EAB Decisions 2024-EAB-0714 and 2024-EAB-0715).

EVIDENTIARY MATTER: EAB has considered additional evidence when reaching this decision under OAR 471-041-0090(1) (May 13, 2019). The additional evidence consists of claimant's response to the appellant questionnaire and the postmarked envelope in which the applications for review were

mailed. This evidence has been marked as EAB Exhibit 1, and a copy provided to the parties with this decision. Any party that objects to our admitting EAB Exhibit 1 must submit such objection to this office in writing, setting forth the basis of the objection in writing, within ten days of our mailing this decision. OAR 471-041-0090(2). Unless such objection is received and sustained, the exhibit will remain in the record.

FINDINGS OF FACT: (1) Order No. 24-UI-266505, mailed to claimant on September 18, 2024, stated, “You may appeal this decision by filing the attached form Application for Review with the Employment Appeals Board within 20 days of the date that this decision is mailed.” Order No. 24-UI-266505 at 2. Order No. 24-UI-266505 also stated on its Certificate of Mailing, “Any party may appeal this Order by filing a Request for Review with the Employment Appeals Board no later than October 8, 2024.”

(2) Order No. 24-UI-266501, mailed to claimant on September 18, 2024, stated, “You may appeal this decision by filing the attached form Application for Review with the Employment Appeals Board within 20 days of the date that this decision is mailed.” Order No. 24-UI-266501 at 2. Order No. 24-UI-266501 also stated on its Certificate of Mailing, “Any party may appeal this Order by filing a Request for Review with the Employment Appeals Board no later than October 8, 2024.”

CONCLUSIONS AND REASONS: Claimant’s late applications for review of Orders No. 24-UI-266505 and 24-UI-266501 are dismissed.

An application for review is timely if it is filed within 20 days of the date that the Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH) mailed the order for which review is sought. ORS 657.270(6); OAR 471-041-0070(1) (May 13, 2019). The 20-day filing period may be extended a “reasonable time” upon a showing of “good cause.” ORS 657.875; OAR 471-041-0070(2). “Good cause” means that factors or circumstances beyond the applicant’s reasonable control prevented timely filing. OAR 471-041-0070(2)(a). A “reasonable time” is seven days after the circumstances that prevented the timely filing ceased to exist. OAR 471-041-0070(2)(b). A late application for review will be dismissed unless it includes a written statement describing the circumstances that prevented a timely filing. OAR 471-041-0070(3).

The applications for review of Orders No. 24-UI-266505 and 24-UI-266501 were due by October 8, 2024. Because claimant did not file their applications for review until October 9, 2024,¹ the applications for review were late. Claimant provided a written statement with the applications for review, in the form of a late response to the appellant questionnaires. However, claimant’s written statement did not describe circumstances preventing them from filing the applications for review on time, but instead related only to why they filed late requests for hearing on decision # 104209 and the June 24, 2021, overpayment decision. Accordingly, claimant did not show good cause for the late applications for review, and claimant’s late applications for review are dismissed.

¹ The filing date for an application for review filed by mail is the postmark date affixed to the envelope in which the application was mailed. OAR 471-041-0065(1)(b) (May 13, 2019). The postmark date on the envelope in which claimant mailed their application for review was October 9, 2024; that date is therefore the filing date.

DECISION: The applications for review filed October 9, 2024, are dismissed. Orders No. 24-UI-266505 and 24-UI-266501 remain undisturbed.
